Thank you for coming to Parents' Evening this week I hope you have found it useful. Thank you also for the questionnaires, we value your ideas and views and will change our policy if we feel that there is a need.

The children who were vaccinated yesterday were extremely brave; thank you to all those parents who got their children here on time for their vaccination, it was a very busy day. In the afternoon I had a whole school assembly where I congratulated those children who had had the injection. We gave them all a big clap. I then explained, in infant language, how the nasty germ which makes you very poorly lives in poo and that it is most important that when you go to the toilet you flush the poo away and wash your hands with soap and water. (You have to be straight to the point with little children so they understand exactly what you are talking about).

We have noticed that many children will not flush the toilet and will continue to use a toilet which is obviously in need of a flush, thereby causing it to block. They have been told that they MUST ALWAYS flush the toilet even if they have to wait for the cistern to fill up. They have also been told that if they go to the toilet and there is poo already there they must tell their teacher. In the short term this may be time consuming but in the light of what has happened I think it is most important.

Please support us at home by ensuring that your child flushes the toilet. School age children are more than capable of doing this but often need reminding. Although it is easier to flush it for them, children need to know that it is totally unacceptable to leave a mess in the toilet. (We also talked about having accidents and getting in a mess and that this was not naughty and they would not get into trouble).
