There is a sign clearly stating that the top end of Poyner Road by the garages is for residents only. Can we take this opportunity to remind you once again -

- DO NOT park in Whitefriars/Beech Gardens this is for residents only as sign posted
- **DO NOT** park in Bromley Road this is a private road and is for pedestrian access only continued parking may result in the back gate being locked inconveniencing our parents who do walk to school
- DO NOT park outside the garages in Poyner Road this is clearly sign posted as being for residents only
- DO NOT block garages and driveways in all the roads around the school (Sandpits Road, Poyner Road, Julian Road, etc)
- **DO NOT** park in the hospital car park
- **DO NOT** park or wait in your vehicle on the zig-zags
- DO NOT park along Gravel Hill in a way which may prevent buses or emergency vehicles getting through

It is very sad that we regularly receive feedback from our neighbours regarding this issue and reflects upon the school and whilst we appreciate that parking is limited we need to think of our wider community. Thank you to all those parents who do park considerately and also to those who walk to school.
